Dave Anderson, council president, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Preparation:

- 2. **Prayer Requests/Homebound**: Mary Herness; Family & Darbara Nelson; Victims of violence/conflict in Middle East and throughout the world.

- 2. An organ tuning company has inspected the church organ. The replacement value of the organ is approximately \$812,848. The organ is insured. - c) <u>WELCA</u>: There will be no meetings in January and February 2024; WELCA will have a hat and mitten tree as well as a box at Ritter's Hardware to collect hats and mittens.
- d) <u>Lutheran Brotherhood</u>: No report.
- 4. **Sharing from SAM**: Scott Brown reviewed duties as a Synod Authorized Minister (SAM). Pastor Greg Ofsdahl will be Scott's mentor.
