Dear Family of God at Our Saviour's,

The first week of August, my son and I took our annual road-trip. This year we went east and did a "Civil War Battle Sites Tour." While on one of our monument walking tours, we heard this story:

A man named Samuel had these (the monuments we were walking by) erected. Samuel had started out as a hired hand on a farm and by sheer determination and frugality, he managed to amass a large fortune over his lifetime. In the process, however, he did not make many friends. He was not close to his wife's family due to the feeling that they thought she had married beneath her status. Bitter about this, and other negative feelings about his own family, he vowed never to leave any of them a dime. When his wife died, (she being the only person he really had any relationship with) he put up an elaborate statue in her memory. Samuel had hired a sculptor to design a monument which showed both her and him at opposite ends of a love seat. He was so happy with the result that he commissioned another statue, this time of himself, kneeling at her grave and placing a wreath on it. This also impressed him greatly, so he planned a third monument. This one was of his wife kneeling at his future gravesite, placing a wreath. He instructed the sculptor to add a pair of wings on her back, giving her the appearance of an angel. Well, as you can already see, one idea led to another until he had spent no less than \$250,000 on these monuments to himself and his wife. The story continued that whenever someone from the town would suggest that he might be interested in a community project such as the hospital, a park, the church... the old guy would frown and shout back, "What has this town ever done for me. I don't owe this town anything!" After using up all his resources on stone statues and selfish pursuits, Samuel died at 92, a grim-faced resident of the poorhouse. The monuments are now sinking into the ground, quickly becoming victims of time and neglect... sad reminders of a self-centered, unsympathetic life. Only one person showed up at Samuel's funeral; the tombstone salesman! My prayer for all of us is that we all remember that the monuments worth building in our lives are those of kindness, love and mercy Nothing else is needed.

Hello all,

A brief introduction, I am Scott Walker Brown. I have been a Lay Minister for many years, providing Supply Pastoral help in 14 different churches. I have been a learner in the Lay School of Ministry, now in my seventh year. I was recently voted onto the Board of Directors of Lay School. As of the writing of this article, a contract has been signed for me to be the Synodically Authorized Minister for United in Faith Parish, pending a "clean" background check. We hope my position will begin December 1 and the contract is for one year. I would like to share some Frequently Asked Questions about the SAM position so you have a better understanding of the need for one.



What is a SAM? A SAM is a Synodically Authorized Minister, a lay person

authorized by the bishop to preach and preside at Holy Communion under special circumstances and specific location.

What are those special circumstances? When word and sacrament ministry is needed and in the prolonged absence of an ordained pastor, the synod bishop may authorize a person who is a member of a congregation of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church of America) to offer this ministry,

What can a SAM do? In the prolonged absence of an ordained pastor, a SAM can preside over communion, lead worship and preach. They may also provide pastoral care, baptize and preside at weddings.

How can our congregation get a SAM? Your council/parish president or officer may contact the synod office to request a SAM to preside at Communion when you are unable to find a pastor to serve for an extended period of time. (This has already been done)

Do we need to contact the synod office if a lay person preaches but we don't have communion? No, the congregation's called pastor may authorize someone who is not an ordained minister to preach and lead a Service of the Word.

Does a SAM need special training? Yes, a two year course through the North West Synod of WI Lay School of Ministry, additional classes in preaching and pastoral care, continuing education at our Lay School or other approved education, background check, boundaries training and meet with supervising pastor.

May we call a SAM a pastor? NO

May a SAM wear a robe/alb? Yes

May a SAM wear a clergy collar or stole? NO

Do we pay a SAM? Yes, the same as a supply pastor including mileage. Follow synod guidelines.

This is new to all of us. We will be learning together so I pray we will be able to communicate and navigate any challenge before us. The Synod will not stop looking for ordained clergy for us, but at this time no one is available to come to our community. My hopes and plans are to be more present in the lives of some of our Parish members by making home visits when requested, visit and provide communion for homebound individuals, visit members who are in hospitals, nursing homes, supported apartments, potentially jail or prison, and maybe sometimes just for fun. I hope to begin Bible Study and Confirmation very soon and continue WELCA Bible Study monthly. I will attend Church Council and Parish Board meetings and any other appropriate meetings that will help the committees.
