Pastor Peter Jonas Epíphany – Three Kíngs



Epiphany is one of my favorite holidays in our Christian liturgical year. The word Epiphany means a revealing or manifestation. Epiphany celebrates the day the star of Bethlehem led the magi or wise men to the presence of Jesus. Through the magi, Jesus is revealed to all the nations they came from. The day of Epiphany is January 6, twelve days after Christmas. Customarily we celebrate it in church on the Sunday before the sixth, but this year we will celebrate it the Sunday after, on January 8.

What I love most about the day is how the journey of the magi sparks my imagination. All the Bible tells us is that they are from "the east". The lack of detail regarding their origins and the beautiful image of the star are quite evocative. They seem to be on some kind of spiritual quest or journey, like the medieval search for the Holy Grail, or a native American vision quest. At the heart of the story, the quest comes to an end when the star stops and the magi find what they are looking for in Jesus. As St. Augustine writes, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

Many traditions and customs have developed around the world to celebrate Epiphany. In the Czech Republic, there is a tradition where people plunge themselves into the freezing cold Vltava River to look for a wooden crucifix. Burrr. But the cultures of Spain and Latin America celebrate Epiphany with unique flair.

They call Epiphany "Three Kings Day". In Madrid, Miami and Puerto Rico there are parades the night before. In Mexico and other Spanish speaking countries and communities they make and eat "Three Kings' Bread". Three Kings Bread, also known as *rosca de reyes*— is an oval-shaped dish made of sweet dough and typically flavored with additions like orange extract, orange blossom water, crystallized fruits, jam, and sugar paste. Children in Puerto Rico collect grass and leave it in a shoe box by their bed, so the magi's camels can have a snack. In the morning, the grass is gone, and in it's place are presents!

Because of the significance of Three Kings Day in Latin American culture, I have invited Deacon Lidixe Montoya to be our guest preacher on Epiphany Sunday. Lidixe is a mission developer in our Northwest Synod of Wisconsin and has started *Neighbor to Neighbor: Together in Ministry*. This ministry is aimed to create bridges between Anglo Lutheran congregations and the Hispanic community in the Eau Claire, Wisconsin area. I became acquainted with Lidixe when she offered to partner with RUTH to organize a health fair for Latin Americans in Trempealeau County. (continued on page 3)




The Sunday School Children performed their Christmas program during worship service on Sunday, December 18th. Great Job Everyone!!!


