Dear Family of God at Our Saviour's,

The first week of August, my son and I took our annual road-trip. This year we went east and did a "Civil War Battle Sites Tour." While on one of our monument walking tours, we heard this story:

A man named Samuel had these (the monuments we were walking by) erected. Samuel had started out as a hired hand on a farm and by sheer determination and frugality, he managed to amass a large fortune over his lifetime. In the process, however, he did not make many friends. He was not close to his wife's family due to the feeling that they thought she had married beneath her status. Bitter about this, and other negative feelings about his own family, he vowed never to leave any of them a dime. When his wife died, (she being the only person he really had any relationship with) he put up an elaborate statue in her memory. Samuel had hired a sculptor to design a monument which showed both her and him at opposite ends of a love seat. He was so happy with the result that he commissioned another statue, this time of himself, kneeling at her grave and placing a wreath on it. This also impressed him greatly, so he planned a third monument. This one was of his wife kneeling at his future gravesite, placing a wreath. He instructed the sculptor to add a pair of wings on her back, giving her the appearance of an angel. Well, as you can already see, one idea led to another until he had spent no less than \$250,000 on these monuments to himself and his wife. The story continued that whenever someone from the town would suggest that he might be interested in a community project such as the hospital, a park, the church... the old guy would frown and shout back, "What has this town ever done for me. I don't owe this town anything!" After using up all his resources on stone statues and selfish pursuits, Samuel died at 92, a grim-faced resident of the poorhouse. The monuments are now sinking into the ground, quickly becoming victims of time and neglect... sad reminders of a self-centered, unsympathetic life. Only one person showed up at Samuel's funeral; the tombstone salesman!

My prayer for all of us is that we all remember that the monuments worth building in our lives are those of kindness, love and mercy. Nothing else is needed.

Council Minutes September 5, 2023

Board Members Present: Dave Anderson, Kris Dubiel, Marnie Anderson, Clarice Laehn, Steve Lamberson, Jacob Paulson, Sharon Ivers, Jenny Everson, Barb Mathson and Lori Paulson.

Also Present: Pastor Greg Ofsdahl of Peace Lutheran, Shirley Mathson congregation member, and Dave Nadolny of Graphic House National Sign Firm.

Dave Anderson, council president, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Preparation:

- 1. **Opening Devotions**: Meeting opened with devotions by Clarice Laehn
- 2. Dave Anderson introduced Pastor Greg Ofsdahl of Peace Lutheran Church who is serving as interim administrative pastor, assisting in finding supply pastors and a regular interim pastor.
- 3. Mr. Nadolny of Graphic House Sign Firm provided information and answered questions regarding the replacement of the existing church sign which is falling apart. There is one person trying to keep the messages updated but it is a difficult task and not feasible to expect this to continue. A new electronic sign could be programmed from anywhere by computer and would be user-friendly. There is power running out to the current sign, however new wiring would be needed. Also, because the sign would be along State Highway 53 the DOT would have to be consulted. The sign company would handle this. The estimated cost of an electronic sign would be \$30,000 to \$50,000 depending on the design. Payment for the new sign would come from fundraisers and those wanting to donate toward the new sign. This cost would not come from regular offerings. So far there is approximately \$5,000 in the sign fund. There were concerns voiced about other structural problems with the church building such as the boiler and roof that need attention, and there was some question as to whether the sign would help to bring more people to church. Council president Dave Anderson appointed a sign committee consisting of Shirley Mathson, Barb Mathson, Kris Dubiel, Marnie Anderson, and Jacob Paulson to gather more information for presentation to the council.
- 3. **Prayer Requests/Homebound:** Pastor Ofsdahl has visited congregation members residing at Grandview in Blair.

Communication/Action:

- 1. **Secretary's Report**: Barb Mathson made a motion to approve minutes of August 1, 2023, with a second by Clarice Laehn. Motion carried.
- 2. **Treasurer's Report**: Steve Lamberson and Barb Mathson presented the following fund balances: General Fund: \$55,986; On Going: \$12,270.25; Improvement: \$35,155. Marnie Anderson made a motion to approve the treasurer's report with a second by Clarice Laehn. Motion carried.
- 3. **Ministry Teams Updates:**
- a) <u>Board of Education:</u>
 - 1. Sunday School registration is scheduled for September 10th and first day of Sunday School is September 17th. Jenny Everson will be the teacher. A congregational picnic is scheduled for October 1st. All are invited to attend.
 - 2. Board of Education will consult with Pastor Ofsdahl to see if it would be possible to combine Our Saviour's and Grace Lutheran confirmation classes with Peace Lutheran.
 - 3. Third grade and Pre K bible handouts on hold for now.
 - 4. Bible study on hold for now.



- b) <u>Music & Worship</u>:
 - 1. Maren Spencer played for Sunday, September 3rd service. She asked not to be paid and wanted it to be a birthday present from her to her dad Phillip Thomte.
 - 2. Noisy Offering for September is going to residents of LaHaina, Maui after wildfires swept through their town. It will be routed through ELCA-Disaster Relief. Noisy Offering for August of \$336 is going to the Coraliz and Samuel Perez family.
 - 3. Dave Anderson will clarify to congregation that the Noisy Offering is separate from regular offering.
- c) <u>Life & Growth:</u> Continue to work Mission Kits.
- d) <u>WELCA:</u> Continue to work on Mission Kits; mystery meal is this Thursday, September 7th.
- e) <u>Lutheran Brotherhood</u>: Church sign discussed earlier in this meeting.
- f) <u>Finance & Property</u>: Sunday offerings are down substantially.
- g) Letters will be sent out asking for donations in lieu of Harvest Dinner. The Harvest Dinner raffle will still be held.
- h) Pastor Ofsdahl confirmed there are supply pastors for Sunday services through October.

a) The next council meeting is scheduled for October 3, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.
