### Sam's Report



Hello siblings in Christ,



February 2nd is the anniversary of the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple by Joseph and Mary. Luke 2:22-24 22When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord 23(as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), 24and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons."

At this visit they met Simeon, a very righteous and devout Jewish man who was told by the Holy Spirit that he would not die until he had seen the Lord's Messiah. When Jesus was placed into his arms in the Temple, he praised God, saying, (Luke 2:29-32) 29"master, now you are dismissing you servant in peace according to your word; 30 for my eyes have seen your salvation, 31 which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, 32a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." The Prophet, Anna was also present that day as she lived in the Temple and "worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day." She began to "praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem"

Some in the Jewish community began to believe that Jesus was the Messiah, however, his neighbors in Nazareth could not believe that the son of Joseph, a carpenter, could possibly be the Messiah and nearly pushed him off of a cliff for even saying he was.

Jesus leaves his home and travels to the area called Capernaum and continues his ministry, healing the sick, casting out demons, cleansing lepers, and calling his disciples. We will learn a lot from Luke the entire month of February leading up to the Transfiguration of Our Lord March 2 and then we will begin Lent with Ash Wednesday on March 5.

I hope to be involved with the Round Robin ministry during Lent again this year. The Pastors and SAMs who participate in this each year find it very rewarding. We are all able to travel to many of our neighbor churches in the Dairyland Conference and meet many wonderful Christians along the way. Pastors and SAMs have reported that they have enjoyed meeting you as well. The theme has not yet been chosen. I will let you all know what it is next month.

We have another annual fundraiser coming up in February. Each year the 8 th graders go on the Washington DC trip and Our Saviour's has a breakfast that raises money for the students. Hadley Kulig and Hartlin Klidzejs will be going on the trip and would appreciate any financial help we can give. February 16th has been chosen from 9:30-noon.
