

Hello All, Happy Autumn:

Mark 10:13-16 13People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. 14But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. 15Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." 16And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

Sunday School and Confirmation are starting up again in October. The 6<sup>th</sup> at Melby Park for Sunday School and the 9<sup>th</sup> for Confirmation in the Sunday School Building. Both these learning opportunities were not available to children during the time of Jesus. Children were not valued at all by the Jewish society. Jesus is changing both the social and religious structure at the same time. He is teaching that unless we let go of our "adult" view of the Kingdom of God and receive it as a child, we will never enter into the Kingdom. I think children often accept things by true faith. They do not have to know every detail, do not have to debate the pro's and con's, do not have to check to see which organizations or political parties are for or against, just accept what is placed in front of them by a trusted person. God is always going to tell them the truth and when He speaks, all God's children can believe.

We have been learning that the disciples often do not understand what Jesus is attempting to teach them and sometimes are afraid to ask him to clarify what he means. We continue to study the Bible to help us gain clarity into God's word. Some Christians just "read and believe". Others read, read again, look at other Bible translations and commentaries, discuss with others and then come to a realization and "believe", or not. We will not truly understand it all until we die, go to Heaven and have God explain it to us. We have fun at Bible Study, discussing what we think God means. All questions are allowed to be asked, no opinion is denied, and God only knows how close or how far off we are with our answers. We would love to have you join us for Wednesday Bible Study, none of us has all the answers, sometimes we just generate more questions and that is OK.

Another trait of a few of the disciples is one of trying to figure out who is the best. They had a lot of travel time on foot, as they moved from town to town, and had to discuss something. Occasionally, in sporting terms, which one of us is the G.O.A.T. (Greatest of all Time). Jesus impressed upon them that "the last shall be first and the first shall be last" and the greatest of you must be a servant to all. Jesus came to us as a servant leader. He was kind to all and helped as many people as he could with their specific needs. Jesus wants us to be a helper to others, service in this case is helping a neighbor where help is needed.

Helping by volunteering within the church building and programs is being a servant too. Some of our "servants" have been helping for many years and would like to have a replacement. If God has planted a seed of helpfulness within you, please let someone on the council know your desire to help.

Please enjoy the changing colors of the season while you are spreading God's Love to others.

- 3. Communication from Congregation:

  - Consider announcing the names of those who have passed at the beginning of Sunday service.
