

Hello All,

Already September? How in the world did this happen? Beef and Dairy Days is now over for the year and that fact usually signals the eminent end of summer. If we did not see you often these past three months, there are still a few pews open that we would love to see filled or at least mostly occupied as we begin autumn. You are welcome anytime, we love to see you and catch up on your stories. Our Gospel readings are again back in the book of Mark. Jesus begins to trouble the Elders of the Jewish faith with his different and God inspired interpretation of the law, and slowly pushing them to understand that He is truly the son of God.

We as humans know that there are two sides to every story. We often take only one side and run with it, not spending the time necessary to understand what prompted the action from the other viewpoint. Jesus spends all of his dedicated time for ministry, telling people the word of God, the truth, however, many who began to follow him, had very strong ties to their upbringing and the Jewish traditions. They could not believe what they heard from Jesus. I understand their choice, Mosaic Law was all they knew until Jesus arrived. The image that was taught about the Messiah did not fit this man who was a carpenter from Nazareth. Jesus was not preaching and teaching strong human leadership skills that would help them overcome the Roman Empire and have their freedom back.

The Scribes and Pharisees closely observed Jesus and his disciples as they moved around city to city, preaching, teaching, healing, performing many miracles/signs, and all they could see is men who are not following the traditions of the elders. Mark 7:6-9, Jesus said to them, "Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines.' You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition."

Jesus knows what to say to the Jewish elders at every encounter. He is able to set aside their challenges and keep teaching God's word. He is able to cure a man born with speech and hearing loss. He honors the faith of a Gentile woman who comes to Jesus asking him to cast out an unclean spirit in her daughter. At first Jesus does not take into consideration the other side of the story until he sees the faith in this woman and then chooses to cast out the demon. Jesus feeds four thousand people with seven loaves in Chapter 8. He cures a blind man from Bethsaida. Jesus also in this chapter, has found his way into Peter's heart and Peter is able to say to Jesus, "You are the Messiah".

All these things happen in the early years of Jesus ministry so he often tells his Disciples and the people he helps, not to tell anyone. He is certain that the more the Jewish elders know about His connection to God, the stronger they will push to have him arrested and killed. We understand that is the plan and the path to our sins being forgiven, but "not just yet" in our September lessons. Jesus needs to continue God's plan for him. Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. We are very blessed to know Him



5-8pm Movie and Facilitated Discussion


Documentary, dinner and facilitated discussion led by a caregiver from the documentary, Lindsay Perrin.
